Attendees were each given a small mirror disk to remember that he added to the three traditional statements: I hear - I forget; I see - I remember; I do - I understand; and then I reflect - I learn.

Jim Trefzger demonstrated how a course like finite mathematics can be "reformed" with new slants on traditional topics. The Year Ahead

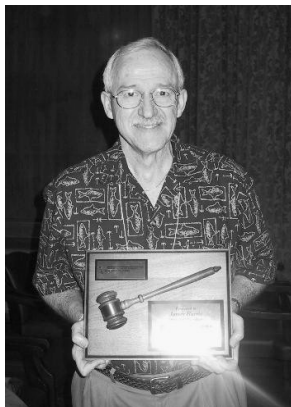
President's Message Continued

RAND Mathematics Study Panel Releases Report

Mathematics Proficiency for All Students: Toward a Strategic Research and Development Program in Mathematics Education

RAND is managing a long-term research planning effort designed to support the nation's schools in teaching all students reading and mathematics. As part of this effort, the RAND Mathematics Study Panel has drafted a report intended to help the U.S. Department of Education consider possible programs of research aimed at developing mathematical proficiency for all students.

An important piece of this initiative is to build community among researchers, practitioners, and policy makers by widely sharing study group ideas and seeking a critique of the Draft Report.

Bob Custer Receives 2002 Distinguished Service Award

Robert Custer, retired Black Hawk College technical mathematics professor, was a charter member of IMACC and served on the Board of Directors of IMACC (1977-80 and 1982-86). Jim Trefzger relates that, " Bob simply took it upon himself to start a photographic record of our Allerton Park meetings. Bob LOVES to take pictures; and I mean he took pictures of EVERYTHING. By the early 1980's, his name began to be listed under the heading of 'IMACC photographer' and by the mid 1980's he was officially designated as IMACC historian." Barbara Juister documents his service and contributions to IMACC in her historical account, "The Development of IMACC through 1994." Many of the photographs used in the publication were credited to Bob Custer. He also served on the IMACC Scholarship Committee, the Nominating Committee, and the Audit Committee. In 1987, Bob was in the first group to receive the Life Membership Award.



Bob had a special interest in technical mathematics, but even more so, he found value in the IMACC Allerton conference in discussing mathematics instruction with attendees from around the state. In support of the nomination, Barb Juister remembered that "Bob was always an enthusiastic advocate of technical mathematics and tried to keep us aware of it. My strongest memories are of him on his soapbox. I think that he was on more than one program speaking about new things in Technical mathematics."

In 1978 when I began working with Bob in the technical mathematics lab at Black Hawk, programmed instruction materials, which Bob wrote, were used for three courses. At that time, he also had an interest in using computers and the "new" personal computers being introduced. That interest combined with his interest in astronomy and solar eclipse "chasing" continues today. If you would like, we might be able to convince him to bring his PC-guided telescope for a "pre-conference star party" on Thursday evening before the conference next April. I also hope that he will again be able to share his Allerton slides in some way at the meeting. The pictures and Bob are fantastic.

New Award!

IMACC Award for Teaching Excellence

Beginning this year a new annual award will be given to an outstanding mathematics teacher in a community college. The recipient of this award will then be nominated for the AMATYC Award for Teaching Excellence to be given next spring (and every odd-numbered year). Please take time to nominate a colleague who you feel is an outstanding teacher and who meets the following criteria.

- a) Instructional Effectiveness and Support of Students
innovative teaching strategies, alternative assessment methods, curriculum development, creating a learning environment for all students, accessible to students in and out of the classroom, etc.
- b) Professional Involvement and Professional Development/Renewal Activities
active participation in professional organizations, speeches, articles, conferences, etc.
- c) Service to Departments/Division/College
active contributor to college community

Nominees must be IMACC members whose primary assigned duties must be delivering instruction in an associate degree granting program. Nominees must have the equivalent of a minimum of 5 years of full-time teaching experience. Individuals can be selected for the award only once.

IMACC members and non-members, such as a supervisor, may nominate. Members may nominate themselves.

Nominations must include:

- a) **cover letter** from nominator addressing the three criteria above (not to exceed 3 pages)
- b) completed **nomination form** (see page 6).
