Furthermore, those who took part in Mr. Triola's follow-up session on the teaching of statistics were provided with an introduction to his teaching philosophy in addition to much lively discussion among the participants on what topics to emphasize and which to de-emphasize.

This year's attendees had a wide array of topic selections as they chose among the breakout sessions. From math for elementary education to linear algebra, calculus to the Crossroads, assessment, and even a first-timer's session (thanks, Bettie), there was something for all tastes at Allerton. Thanks again to all those who hosted these well received breakout sessions. And an added thanks to Marv Johnson for his Friday evening talk on Ancient Computational Tools. The Awards Committee was busy this year and IMACC presented the following awards at Friday night's dinner: The Distinguished Service Award was presented to Jim Harris. Jim Olsen of Western Illinois University received the James Armstrong Award. Also, Life Membership Awards were presented to Sarah Brodd and Ruth Hartman of Black Hawk College, Jackie LeFebvre of Illinois Central College, and Ruth Bradburn of Wasco

IMACC Award for Teaching Excellence

This annual award will be given to an outstanding mathematics teacher in a community college. The recipient of this award will then be nominated for the AMATYC Award for Teaching Excellence (page 6) to be given next spring (and every odd-numbered year). Please take time to nominate a colleague whom you feel is an outstanding teacher and who meets the following criteria.

- a) Instructional Effectiveness and Support of Students
innovative teaching strategies, alternative assessment methods, curriculum development, creating a learning environment for all students, accessible to students in and out of the classroom, etc.
- b) Professional Involvement and Professional Development/Renewal Activities
active participation in professional organizations, speeches, articles, conferences, etc.
- c) Service to Departments/Division/College
active contributor to college community

Nominees must be IMACC members whose primary assigned duties must be delivering instruction in an associate degree granting program. Nominees must have the equivalent of a minimum of 5 years of full-time teaching experience. Individuals can be selected for the award only once.

IMACC members and non-members, such as a supervisor, may nominate. Members may nominate themselves.

Nominations must include:

- a) **cover letter** from nominator addressing the three criteria above (not to exceed 3 pages)
- b) completed **nomination form** (see page 4).

2004 AMATYC Mathematics Excellence Award

Call for Nominations

Deadline: November 3, 2003

Nominations are now open for the next AMATYC Mathematics Excellence Award, which will be presented at the 2004 AMATYC Annual Conference in Orlando, FL. Nomination materials include a resume or vita (not to exceed 3 pages) and three letters in support of the nomination, one of which is a letter of nomination. At least one of the three letters should be from outside the nominee's AMATYC region.

Letters of support that elaborate on those qualities mentioned in the resume or point out additional exemplary characteristics of the nominee are more helpful to the committee than letters that reiterate items mentioned in the resume. In an effort to compare all candidates on the same basis, any additional materials submitted will not be considered.

The Mathematics Excellence Award Committee will consider each of the nominations in accordance with the following criteria:

- National reputation (20 points)
- Leadership and activities in professional organizations (20 points)
- Professional talks and presentations (10 points)
- Awards and grants received (10 points)
- Publications (10 points)
- Professional activities on a regional, state, and national scale (10 points)
- Teaching Expertise (15 points)
- Other contributions to mathematics and/or mathematics education (5 points).
