Congratulations also go to Jim Trefzger (Parkland College), who was presented with the Teaching Excellence Award. If you have had the opportunity to hear Jim speak on Calculus (one of his favorite topics), then you completely understand why he received this award. I hope his students realize how lucky they are to have such a dynamic instructor. Next year, we will celebrate IMACC's 30th Anniversary. Be sure to make the conference at Allerton a priority.

Now let's look at some of the changes. After nine years as Treasurer of IMACC, Dave Clydesdale (Harper College) has become President-Elect. I want to take this opportunity to thank Dave for his dedicated service, and encourage him, during this coming year, to not only help me learn the ropes, but also to assist Steve Kifowit (Prairie State College), as he takes on the responsibility of the Treasurer's position. Vicki Beitler (Parkland College) will remain Secretary, and John Bradburn (retired from Elgin C.C.) and Brenda Alberico (College of DuPage) were re-elected to the Board of Directors. I'd like to welcome Amy Trefzger (College of Lake County) to the Board, and say good bye and thank you to Sandra Cox (Kaskaskia C.C.) for her years of service. As everyone knows, our

organization is great because of the involvement of so many talented and generous individuals. Thank you to all of the Board members, committee chairs, and members at large who continue to give their valuable time to IMACC.

If you would like to get more involved in IMACC, or if you have someone in mind to recommend, please inform Dave Clydesdale in the near future. He will be coordinating the slate of candidates for next year's election, and would welcome any and all suggestions.

In this year's election materials, our candidates shared their visions for IMACC's future with you. In this time of flux at all of our colleges and in the state, we will attempt to keep our members informed and up-to-date on all current issues. Budgetary concerns are somewhat beyond our control, but we can certainly be supportive of one another, and share any cost-saving ideas that are working. Another area that is undergoing great change is the teacher education program. The AAT degree was discussed at Allerton with a representative from ICCB, prompting much emailing in the weeks that followed. This topic promises to present continuing challenges to

the community colleges in the future, and will be revisited next year. Catherine Moushon, along with others, worked long and hard to plan and advertise the Teacher Preparation Workshop (to be offered this summer). Unfortunately, the minimum number of participants was not achieved by the deadline, and the workshop was cancelled. Catherine and I also collaborated on the application to AMATYC for a traveling teacher ed workshop next year, but we were denied that also. But we'll keep trying! If you have any ideas, please share them with either Catherine or myself. The same applies for sessions at next year's conference. By then, we should have a better perspective on state funding, more of us will have experienced NCA/HLC site visits, and more AAT programs will have been created. Let us know what you want, and we'll do our best to accommodate!

I'm looking forward to seeing many of you in South Holland at the Board meeting in October, or in Orlando at the AMATYC Conference in November. Have a great summer.

AMATYC Student Mathematics League 2003-2004 Final Results

The AMATYC Student Mathematics League (SML) Contest was completed in March. Illinois had two community colleges in the top twenty nationally; William Rainey Harper College finished 5th and Parkland College ended up in a tie for 20th place. Two students from Illinois ranked in the national top 10: Bryan Gillis (2nd) from William Rainey Harper College and Richard Van Note (7th) from Parkland College.

In the Mid-West Region, Illinois was well represented. The top four colleges in the region came from our state with Harper and Parkland being joined by College of DuPage and Oakton. Illinois community college students performed very well regionally: seven of the top 10 students and 12 of the top 19 students in our region hailed from Illinois community colleges.

IMACC Award for Teaching Excellence

This annual award will be given to an outstanding mathematics teacher in a community college. The recipient of this award will then be nominated for the AMATYC Award for Teaching Excellence. Please take time to nominate a colleague whom you feel is an outstanding teacher and who meets the following criteria.

- a) Instructional Effectiveness and Support of Students
innovative teaching strategies, alternative assessment methods, curriculum development, creating a learning environment for all students, accessible to students in and out of the classroom, etc.
- b) Professional Involvement and Professional Development/Renewal Activities
active participation in professional organizations, speeches, articles, conferences, etc.
- c) Service to Departments/Division/College
active contributor to college community

Nominees must be IMACC members whose primary assigned duties must be delivering instruction in an associate degree granting program. Nominees must have the equivalent of a minimum of 5 years of full-time teaching experience. Individuals can be selected for the award only once.

IMACC members and non-members, such as a supervisor, may nominate. Members may nominate themselves.

Nominations must include:

- a) **cover letter** from nominator addressing the three criteria above (not to exceed 3 pages)
- b) completed **nomination form** (see page 7).
