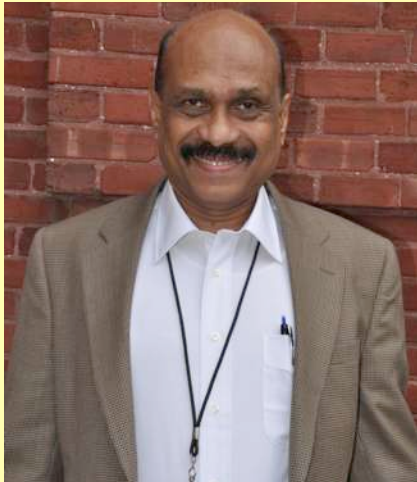

It was great to see so many of you at IMACC's annual conference which was held April 12-14 at Allerton Park. Steve Kifowit, serving as our 43rd president, did a wonderful job planning, preparing, and running the conference. Joseph Gallian from the University of Minnesota, Duluth was as entertaining as ever during his two keynote addresses titled "The Making of the 2003 and 2010 Math Awareness Month Posters" and "Breaking Driver's License Codes." Jaclyn Murawska, President of the ICTM, from St. Xavier University made a keynote presentation on "Mathematical Knowledge for Teaching at the Developmental Level: Does Caring Count?" She was joined by Keith Nabb also from St. Xavier University via satellite. The conference included many breakout sessions, round table discussions, and committee meetings. Thanks so much to all of you who presented, facilitated, or contributed in any way.

Kathy Almy of NIU Center for P-20 Engagement made a presentation on the new Transitional Math Initiative. This is mandated by the Postsecondary and Workforce Readiness Act of Illinois. As a result, transitional math courses are being developed and piloted. Upon successful completion, students will earn guaranteed placement out of remediation at all Illinois community colleges and some Illinois universities, according to Almy. Emily Buhnerkempe and Ashley Becker of ICCB led a discussion regarding the draft that has been sent to the Illinois Council of Community College Presidents (ICCCP) for their approval on April 17th. This is a draft of "Recommendations of the ICCCAO and ICCCSO on Placement Methods and Scores." There was a measure in this draft that many IMACC members questioned. As a result, the IMACC board worked hard to get the questionable measure removed from the draft. We would like to thank Dr. Judy Marwick, 25th President of IMACC, Dr. Brian Durham of ICCB, and Dr. John Avendano, the President of ICCCP for helping us get this questionable measure removed. Dr. Avendano even moved the vote to May 1st.

Keven Hansen of Southwestern Illinois College, the chair of the Curriculum Committee and the 36th President of IMACC was recognized with the Distinguished Service Award and Tony Paris of Carl Sandburg College received the Teaching Excellence Award.

With the recent IMACC election, Diane Koenig of Rock Valley College was elected as the president elect. Jeremy Chamberlain of Harper College and Mike Caparula of Kankakee College joined

Curriculum Corner

The following is a report from the Curriculum Committee on several of the current focus items:

1. Work at the state level on a multiple measures placement recommendation continues to move forward. The IMACC board has been actively involved in working with ICCB, the CAO group, and the Presidents Council to ensure the document allows for the continuation of best practices and serves our students well. While not setting ranges for placement tools like ALEKS or Accuplacer, the document does set a college-readiness level for ACT (22 in Math) and SAT (530 in Math). A major change in the most recent draft was to remove College Algebra from the list of courses covered by the placement documentation. Continuing discussions will likely be had regarding other measures such as high school GPA. The final version will need to be approved by the Presidents Council. I'd like to thank everyone who got involved to make this set of recommendations better!
2. By Fall 2019, all community college districts in Illinois will be offering at least one Transitional Math course (another "piece" of multiple measures of placement). The pathways have been re-named (again): Transition to STEM, Transition to Quantitative Literacy/Statistics, and Transition to Technical Math. If you'd like to learn mores about these courses, contact Kathy Almy, Illinois Director for Transitional Math, at kalmy@niu.edu. She is continuing to conduct summits on this for interested colleges. Thanks to Kathy and the many who presented and were involved in discussions about these courses at the IMACC annual conference.
3. General Education Statistics will soon (if it isn't there already) have a new descriptor at the website: <http://itransfer.org/courses/gecc/mathematics.php> This was the combined work of the IAI panel and a sub-group of the IMACC Curriculum Committee. The new description reflects current trends in statistics education, decreasing time spent on counting and classical probability theory and increasing student understanding through simulation. **Volunteers are needed to update the Articulation Guide's statistics courses--email me at keven.hansen.swic.edu if you are interested!**

If your college doesn't have representation on the Curriculum Committee, consider volunteering. We'd like to have at least one member from every community college. 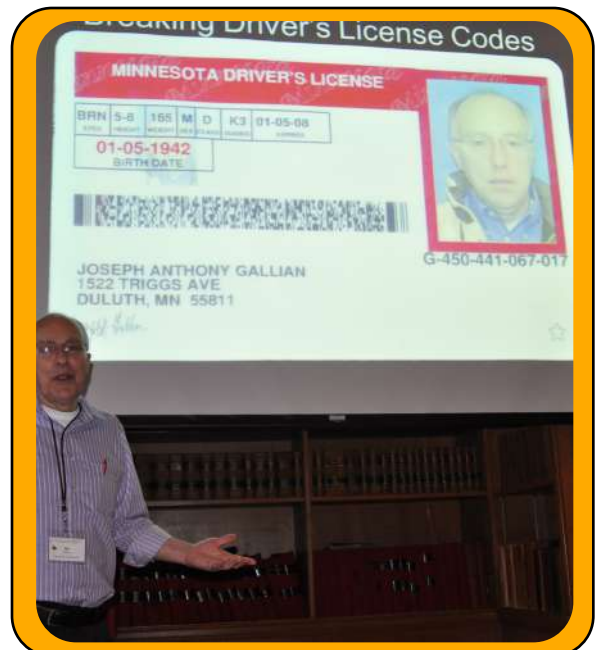
Jeremy Chamberlain's presentation on "Using Technology to Foster Collaborative Learning" introduced attendees to several new apps and websites to use in the classroom.

Member Spotlight

In this issue the Member Spotlight is on a past president of IMACC, Jim Trefzger of Parkland College.

Jim Trefzger



Jim Trefzger's 40 year career in higher education began with a very lucky break: the U of I math department in conjunction with the federal government messed up his financial aid for graduate school! Jim had just completed his B.S. (major: Math; minors: Computer Science & Psychology) at the U of I and had been singled out to receive a fellowship from a grant whose funding was suddenly eliminated by the Nixon administration. Prof. James Armstrong, Supervisor of Mathematics Graduate Students and later a co-founder of IMACC, came to the rescue, finding him an assistantship outside the department, tutoring math with the Expanded Encounter with Learning (just don't call it the "eel" program). Armstrong didn't stop there, though. He asked Jim to be his graduate assistant the following summer to help with a post-mortem on the grant. Jim had completed his M.S. in Math in May, so just before the fall semester, when the University of Missouri-St. Louis called with an emergency last-minute opening for a Visiting Instructor in Mathematical Sciences, Armstrong suggested that they hire Jim. So in 1974, at age 23, he became a full-time faculty member at UMSL. After a year there, they dropped the "visiting" from his title and gave him a 3.7% (\$300) raise during a salary freeze! But in January,

1976, Jim jumped at the chance to have a permanent teaching position at McHenry County College. That April, Jim represented MCC at the very first annual meeting of IMACC, and he has now attended all 43 of them. He became the MCC math department coordinator at age 31, and a few years later, the nominating committee asked him to skip his last year as an IMACC Board member to serve as IMACC's 13th President (1987-88). In 1987, AMATYC President Steve Rodi appointed Jim (and Mike Dellens of Texas) to represent AMATYC at the Conference on Calculus for a New Century in Washington, D.C. In June, 1988, Jim was named the Outstanding Community College Faculty Member in the state by ICCTA; but two months later, he was moving to Champaign to accept an invitation to teach at Parkland College. Jim taught 20 years at Parkland full-time, 4 years half-time as a professor emeritus, and 2 more years as a part-time instructor before retiring completely in August, 2014. Parkland highlights include:

- Principal Investigator/Project Director on National Science Foundation and Dwight D. Eisenhower Grants totaling over \$450,000.
- Co-author, along with Dale Ewen and Joan Gary, of a series of Tech Math textbooks for Pearson/Prentice Hall.
- Teaching Excellence Awards from ICTM (1999), AMATYC (2003), and IMACC (2004).
- IMACC Distinguished Service Award (2008).
- ICTM Board Chair (1997-98).
- AMATYC Midwest VP (2007-09).
- Presenter at 18 national conferences. Also a presenter at state math conferences in Illinois, Iowa, New Mexico, South Carolina, Kentucky, and Michigan.
- Gave 8 commercial presentations for Texas Instruments, including the introduction of the TI-84 Plus and TI-89 Titanium to higher education at MathFest 2004 in Providence, RI.

Personal Facts:

- Jim grew up in Waukegan and Bloomington, the middle of three sons.
- Jim and his wife, Dorie, celebrated their 45th wedding anniversary in January and the 50th anniversary of their first date in February.
- Their daughter, Amy Curry, is now an Associate Professor of Mathematics at Warner Pacific University, a small private four-year school in Portland, OR. Previously, she taught mathematics and statistics at the College of Lake County and served on the IMACC Board. Their son, John, is a Private Client Banker for Chase in downtown Champaign.
- Jim joined the musician's union at the age of 16, and still sings and plays French horn and trumpet in public.

4. There was some discussion regarding the status of the geometry requirement at several sessions at the IMACC Annual Conference. At present, the geometry requirement is only in the Articulation Guide for College Algebra and Math for Elementary Teachers, and many schools are struggling with offering this course due to low enrollment. If you have strong feelings on the retention or elimination of this requirement, please email Keven Hansen at keven.hansen@swic.edu. Arguments both for and against are appreciated.
5. Co-requisite courses are another major push, both nationally and within the state. If you haven't done so recently, you should visit <http://itransfer.org/courses/gecc/mathematics.php> to see how the course pre-requisites for some IAI general education math courses have been revised. This new language allows colleges greater flexibility in building co-requisite models. Hopefully, you managed to attend one of the great sessions at the Annual Conference regarding co-requisites.
6. As everyone enters this new era of co-requisite courses, transitional math, and multiple measures placement, don't forget how important it is to assess the effectiveness of these changes. We can only improve if everyone is collecting (and sharing) data on what works (and what doesn't). Please don't assume it is SEP (somebody else's problem)--we as math faculty need to take the lead in producing solid data on how to best help our students.

Annual Conference Registration Fee Waiver Opportunity

For the third year in a row, IMACC will be offering five registration fee waivers for our annual conference. These waivers are intended to support current IMACC members who wish to attend both days of the annual conference, but whose institutions will not provide financial support. Applicants must submit a completed conference registration form along with a signed statement affirming that their colleges are not providing adequate financial support. The registration form and the letter must be received by the conference coordinator no later than February 15. The five recipients will be randomly selected from the applicant pool.
