

# IMACC Membership Meeting

Friday, April 8, 2022

Minutes



51 members in attendance via Zoom

1. Call to order: **Dan Kernler called the meeting to order at 2:03p.m.**
2. Approval of minutes: **Julius Nadas made a motion to approve the minutes and Kyra Rider seconded the motion. The motion carried.**
3. Reports
  - a. Treasurer's report (Natalie McGathey): Amy Madden volunteered for the 2022-2023 Treasurer position and was approved at the 3/24/2022 Board meeting. Many thanks to Amy!  
Not much change other than individual membership income is down since the decision to extend free membership to all IMACC attendees and current members. Web site fees were a little higher this year in order to extend our hosting contract for another 3 years. A large donation was received for the scholarship fund. The budget balanced.  
Proposed 2023 Budget in Appendix at end.  
1 change from previous years: reduction in budget for Math Connexions since almost everyone gets it electronically now. **Jim Trefzger made a motion to approve the proposed 2022-2023 budget. Donna Carlson seconded. The motion carried.**

Membership Statistics (As of March 15)  
Institutional Members: 10 show a 2022 expiry date on website, 21 show expired institutional memberships. Maybe they will renew when we have a live conference again?

Individual Members: 103 Life Members, 25 Registered on website, 50 Have not registered with new site but have contact information, 28 Have no contact information in database.

230 Active Members: 4 Have not registered with new site, 0 Payment pending, 88 "Free Members" (judging by 2021/2022 Registration and 2023 expiry date), 19 Expired Members on Database (Expired prior to March 1, 2022)

Life members have an expiration date set of December 31, 9999, to make them easily identifiable.

All active members had one year added to their membership. This was added in February 2022.

f. Legislative Committee (Michael Caparula): DERA - School initiative report is due to ICCB by May 1. We will show this and talk about what schools are doing during the conference session on April 8<sup>th</sup>.

HB5506 - Amends the DCQA. This allows a high school student to still take a dual credit class even if they don't meet the college's entrance requirement. The student would then just get high school credit. This has passed a 3rd house reading and is now in the Education Committee

SB3856 - Requires all colleges to provide all digital and non-digital coursework materials free of charge to students that are a resident of IL, graduated from an approved HS in IL, enrolled at the college, and does not already possess at least 135 hours of coursework. I have read through this bill, and this is ALL it says. This is now in Senate Assignments.

There are other bills like HB4361 and SB3674 that are interesting, but do not apply directly to IMACC. Special thanks to Chris Appuhn for forwarding a lot of this info.

Anyone can visit [ilga.gov](http://ilga.gov) to look up any or all of these bills. Planning a meeting soon to discuss how to be more in touch with what is going on in Springfield.

Discussion: the dual credit credential requirement has been extended – plan by 2025, complete by 2028 as part of HB5506.

**Statement on the Geometry Requirement for the Mathematics for Elementary Teaching Sequence DRAFT**

Donna Carlson made a motion to approve the statement. Catherine Moushon seconded. Keven Hansen confirmed that this statement has passed ISMAA. Chris Appuhn clarified that this statement does not replace the Gen Ed pathway geometry statement. Motion carried.

**College Algebra and Trigonometry Curriculum Changes in Articulation**

**Guide DRAFT** Mike Caparula made a motion to approve the curriculum changes to all 3 courses in the IMACC articulation guide as a single item. Chris Appuhn seconded. Keven Hansen confirmed that these changes passed ISMAA as one package. Donna Carlson stated that many people and much work was put into these. Discussion was had about future legislation and our possible influence related to this document, especially with respect to items that are identified as optional or further topics. And then about the possibility that IAI may decide to make College Algebra a qualifying Gen Ed math course, and may use our articulation guide to help them develop the IAI requirements. Also about

preparation of international students versus our students. The further topics are chosen as such due to a lack of agreement in ISMAA regarding the focus of trigonometry. Motion passed.
