Curriculum Committee Update by Abby Bailey

Inclusion: If any members want to join the curriculum committee, please do not hesitate to volunteer. Joining the Curriculum Committee is not an elected position, and we like to see representation from each community college. It's a great place to share and learn of new and old curricular ideas. Our next meeting will be held via Zoom on Thursday, September 14th.

Elementary Education: A subcommittee is looking at the prerequisites to this course and consequences of DERA on this course sequence. Currently, [SB2288](#), is a bill that could introduce an elementary and secondary education panel.

Articulation Guide:

- The 2023 Edition contains edits approved by IMACC membership on April 1st and ISMAA membership on March 31st. The current edition is posted on IMACC's website.
- The Committee is reviewing Differential Equations.
- A subcommittee continues to review the feedback and data from you, our membership, before proceeding with editorial recommendations for the developmental section of the Articulation Guide (following Post-Workforce Readiness, Dual Credit Quality, and Education and Workforce Equity or Developmental Education Reform Act).

Membership Concerns:

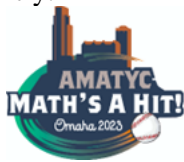
- Accurate assessment of student knowledge continues to be a concern for math courses being offered online without proctored testing. An updated statement was made by the IAI Math Majors Panel in their [Course Approval Criteria](#) regarding clarity on this topic.
- Concerns about credentials for dual credit courses being taught in the high schools continues to be a concern as it impacts the student knowledge of the expected curriculum upon completion. This is now showing a larger prevalence in the precalculus courses across the State.
